#### **ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

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- I noticed a large percentage of LL Bean boots being returned due to the labels coming off the heels. The labels were glued to a flat area of the boot, so I recommended having that part of the mold altered to give it more texture for the label to adhere to. This drastically cut returns due to label adhesion issues.
- While tracking defect rates for boots that were not finish quality, I noticed some molds were working better than others. I copied what worked on newer molds, and had the older molds altered to replicate the new. Defects that year went from ~3% down to 1.2%, which saved over \$90,000.
